

Preventive care medications

Human Immunodeficiency Virus Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis medications available at \$0

Updated Jan. 1, 2023

Under the health reform law (Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act), most private health plans must cover certain preventive care medications at 100% — without charging a copay, coinsurance or deductible.

In response to this law and a United States Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) recommendation, your plan offers coverage of Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) at \$0 when used for prevention.

If you have a higher chance of becoming infected with HIV but are not yet infected, these preventive care medications are available at \$0 if you:

- Are at increased risk for first-time infection with HIV.
- Obtain a copay waiver from a healthcare provider stating the drug is being used for primary prevention of HIV.

As a reminder, most pharmacy benefit plans also cover these medications at a normal copay or coinsurance when they are being used for the treatment of HIV infection.

HIV PrEP medications currently available at \$0

Drug name	Coverage
emtricitabine-tenofovir disoproxil fumarate 200-300mg (generic Truvada)	Copay waiver required for \$0. Truvada available if unable to take generic.
tenofovir (generic Viread)	Copay waiver required for \$0.
Descovy	Copay waiver required for \$0. Descovy available if unable to take generics listed above.
